Picket on speculators



Several dozen young people and families squatting in properties belonging to millionaire property dealer Joe Levy in Euston, London, picketing his headquarters off Piccadilly yesterday in protest against moves to evict 81 of them.

The squatters' organisation, the Tolmers Squatters' Action Group, says it will fight the evictions, due to come to court in three weeks' time, because the council has plans to compulsorily purchase the area in a housing scheme for more than 2,000 local people.

Many of the squatters have lived in the properties for more than 18 months, since a local campaign in the borough, Camden, stopped a bid by one of Mr. Levy's companies to build offices on the site.

Camden housing chairman John Mills said the council "very much opposed" the evictions, particularly as it had received no planning application for the site. The council's own practice was to evict squatters only when it had immediate plans to redevelop or rehabilitate properties.
