# Squatters hearing

One of London's biggest squatters' groups, threatened with eviction, won a temporary reprieve in the High Court yesterday. The first two of 17 applications for possession orders against 81 squatters in the Tolmers Square area of Camden were adjourned for a week.

In both cases Mr Justice Croom-Johnson, sitting in chambers, said he wanted further evidence that every effort had been made to discover the names of the squatters by the company applying for the orders, Glennifer Finance.

The squatters disputed a claim by Mr Ronald Harvey, the process server for Glennifer's solicitors, that he had knocked on the doors nine times but had got no reply on eight of them.

Glennifer is a subsidiary of Mr Joseph Levy's Stock Conversion Trust Development Company.

● TO PURSUE my theme of changing eating habits to suit hard times, you could learn to love the staples: bread, pulses, potatoes and other vegetables at Diwana Bhel-Poori, 121 Drummond Street, N.W.1 (387 5556). The threat of nasty developers seems to engender a lively sense of community in a doomed area and it has happened in Tolmers Village where this restaurant is.

The cheap prices and ingenious and delicious ways of preparing Indian vegetarian ingredients make the Bhel Poori popular with the young residents, or perhaps more accurately squatters. Try the Bhajia, the Bhel Poori, a cold mixture of soft and crisp, and don't miss the paper thin Dosai, a vast, lacy, potato pancake served with curried potatoes and coconut chutney.

No licence but you may bring your own drink, or try lassi made from yogurt. About £2 for two would bring forth a banquet.
