THERE were cheers in the Council Chamber at Wednesday night's meeting of Camden Council when the Leader of the Council (Cllr. Frank Dobson) asked for the withdrawal of a resolution which would give the "go ahead" for negotiations to be completed for the joint development of the multi-million Tolmers Square site with Stock Conversion and Investment Trust. It had been decided at a lengthy meeting of the Community Planning and Resources Committee on Monday night to defer a final decision until alternative proposals had been considered.

At Wednesday night's meeting of the Council Cllr. Dobson told members that more time was needed to consider alternative proposals.

MORE HOMES

These included propositions from Claudius Properties Ltd who had claimed that Camden Council would gain considerably in the amount of housing that could be provided on the site by their proposals.

In the committee's report it stated that while the Council were sympathetic to the proposals from Claudius Properties this would entail making a compulsory purchase order on the site and the Council did not feel that the necessary consent could be obtained from the Department of the Environment.
