ELDERLY tenants on the Regent's Park Estate are living in fear since last week's brutal killing of 62-year-old "campaigner" Mrs. Rosina Gavin. Mrs. Gavin was found dead in her bath by her daughter at her Camden Council flat in the Mosedale block, Cumberland

Murder squad detectives from her body was found. Albany Street are trying to trace Mrs. Gavin's last movements and appeal to anyone who saw her shortly before her death or noticed anything suspicious,

Her body was discovered on the afternoon of Wednesday of last week by her daughter who had noticed that three days sup-

They say there semed to be no motive for the killing. There was no sign of a struggle and no evidence of robbery.

Association told this journal: "Everyone on the estate is very upset; I felt quite sick about it. It is terrible that a thing like this should have happened. "Now the elderly people on the estate are terribly frightened and horrified," added Mrs.
