DETECTIVES piecing together the last hours of murdered widow Mrs Rosina Gavin, are trying to establish if she was near her former home in Tolmers Square, Euston, shortly before she was brutally killed.

Mrs Gavin, 62, whose partially clothed body was dis-covered in the bathroom of her council flat on the Regents Park Estate, was last scen alive at 5 pm, on Saturday, April 28.

One detective working on the case from special head-quarters set up at Albany Street police station, said:

"Anyone who remembers seeing her in the area or who knows that she had an appointment on Saturday evening should contact the police immediately, at 387-1113."
