Council seems cooler

CAMDEN Council kept their options open for the redevelopment, of Tolmers Square as they discussed whether to switch their deal with Joe Levy's Stock Conversion and Investment Trust Ltd. to the new proposals put forward by Claudius Properties.

But there were indications that the proposals put forward by Claudius Properties, under which all the profits from the scheme would be transferred to the council, now did not carry quite so much weight with members of the ruling Labour group.

Cilr Frank Dobson, the leader of the council, warned that there could be long delays if the council, decided to proceed with an

agreement with Cladius Properties, the brainchild of journalists Christopher Booker and Dennie Gray.

He said: "As I understand it they might go on for five years. We must very seriously consider when we consider the financial advantages of one alternative, the social advantages.

"We must consider that we may be condemning a child to five years in a tinking basement and that's what we want to avoid.

Clir Dobson said he wanted to stress that there had been no delays to the project yet. A feasibility study on the area had been completed by the architects.
