

**Tolmers Square:  
many protests**

Cllr. O'Connor's recollection is too short. The Tolmers Square Tenants' Association has protested many times against the actions of the present Tory council in approving proposals for building offices in our square. If he looks he will find public protests to the council (April, 1960) and an invitation to the Chamber of Commerce to support this (July, 1960), before that, of course, we even took a deputation to the council to protest and state our case.

We exist to defend the rights of tenants in this area against such proposals from any quarter, and we have had to be critical at times of the actions of the L.C.C. It is fair to say that in these criticisms we have had the support of the three Labour councillors, particularly Cllr. Tom Braddock.

We are very pleased that the L.C.C. has rejected private office development in Tolmers Square and say again that most of this area should be used for housing, including the rehousing here of the present tenants and house owners, at rents they can afford.

We understand that we have the support of Cllr. Mrs. Leila Campbell for this aim and hope that we have the support of her colleagues who will be asking for our votes on April 13.
